LEARNING DISABILITY (LD): WHAT KIDS NEED TO KNOW

LD = Learning Disability

LDs impact the way our brain handles information.

It's <u>not</u> being lazy or stupid, or because you're <u>not</u> trying!

Other names for LDs include dyslexia, dysgraphia, and dyscalculia.



Symptoms of LD Can Include:

Taking longer to get school work done
Forgetting information you knew before
Flipping the order of letters or numbers
Losing place or missing words when reading
Needing extra help to understand new things

All brains grow with learning, but all brains learn differently!

Everyone with an LD is different.

There are lots of ways to use technology to work around an LD



LDs have nothing to do with how smart you are.

There is often more than one person with LD in a family.



About 1 out of every 10 kids has LD.

Kids with LDs can feel frustrated, angry, sad, and alone.
It can sometimes make friendships hard.
Remember - you're not alone!

- Try learning strategies your parents or teachers suggest
- Pay attention to what things help you and keep doing that!

Self-Advocate

- Know your strengths & ask for help when you need it.
- Everyone needs help from time to time!
- This can look like more time for writing tests and/or more chances to ask questions.

Everyone has areas of strength and areas of weakness.


Every kid has their own special interests, talents, and personality.
